

EGLOSHAYLE, ST. BREOCK AND WADEBRIDGE

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN ADVISORY GROUP

15th APRIL, 2014

1. Present: Simon Malloni (Chair), Tony Rush, Phillip Mutton, Adrian Jones, Tony Faragher, Stephen Knightly, Peter Collis.

Apologies: Pamela Starling, Grenville Stanbury, Jeremy Varcoe, Mike Kent.

2. Minutes of the last meeting (1st April 2014) were received and approved.
3. Land Supply Task Group. Tony Faragher reported that the Group's work is ongoing and they will be convening again soon.
4. Energy Group. Simon Malloni reported that the Energy Chapter is now complete, having been tidied up by Paul Weston. A request to Town Hall staff to add it to the Evidence Report was submitted yesterday.
5. Consultation Event. Members were generally positive about the number of visitors (over 250), the look of the presentation and the usefulness of the feedback. Stephen Knightly outlined an example of a good idea from a member of the public concerning the siting of the football pitch in the development at Bodieve and upon which actions are already being taken.

The questions of data capture and further feedback gathering were considered.

It was agreed that the translation of qualitative into quantitative, representative data would be impossible and that feedback from the Consultation Event should be based upon and summarised under themes. **PC and SM will meet next week to begin the process of recording the data**, using PC's model from the last public event. Ahead of this meeting, **SM will e mail PW for advice.**

We have also requested that, as the next stage of the Plan process, **each topic group should consider and list** (by time of next meeting)

- a) those stakeholders and holders of specialist knowledge and advice to whom we should provide our evidence summaries and from whom we might request further feedback
- b) those issues on which further enquiry is required (things we don't know)
- c) potential for focus groups
- d) suggested means of eliciting the views of those under 40 years of age

SM reported that he is going to ask St Breock PC to prepare a formal response to the evidence report.

There is still a degree of uncertainty concerning how we will translate our findings into concrete options - an issue particularly pertinent to the even public opinion split on renewables and out of town retail. **SM to contact PW for advice on the resolution of divided public feedback**

It was also agreed that the lessons arising from the Event would be best learned by members of the Advisory Group who attended the event preparing a short précis of their impressions, **to be e mailed to SM before the next Advisory meeting.**

6. Communications / Publicity

SM reported that, although a paragraph about the Event had appeared in the Cornish Guardian a fortnight earlier, a request to repeat the coverage in the week of the Event had not been acted upon. He was advised that the local correspondent has changed and **SM will re-submit a photo and summary** to appear as soon as possible, including the website and e mail details for further comment. It was agreed that members should develop a relationship with the new correspondent in order to maximise publicity when the draft plan is presented. AJ was thanked for his efforts to publicise the Event around the town.

It was agreed that the WNP website should continue to act as the vehicle by which ongoing communication with the public can be achieved and that we need to introduce some form of interactivity capability to allow the public to post comments.
